REMOTE LEARNING PARENT NOTIFIED ABSENCES







Click on Parent Notified Absences in the top right of your screen.

Complete a Parent Notified Absence for each child learning remotely.

Select the 'Learning From Home' reason

You can log onto PAM every Monday and complete the Parent Notified Absence for 5 days this alleviates having to log on and do this every day.

REMOTE LEARNING PARENT NOTIFIED ABSENCES

Classroom daily check-ins are not a Roll Mark!

If your child is Learning from Home you will need to send a 'Parent Notified Absence' via PAM by 10:00 am. This will then show up on the classroom teacher roll.

You are able to complete a Parent Notified Absence for a 5 days at a time eg: You log into PAM on Monday and complete the notification for the entire week.

If your child is not at school and we have not received a Parent Notified Absence through PAM you will receive daily SMS messages.

We will send out a 'SkoolBag Message' every Monday morning to remind parents with students working remotely to complete Parent Notified Absences.

A step by step guide on how to complete a Parent Notified Absence is provided on the previous slide.

- Classes receiving a daily slideshow will not receive more than 15 20 slides a day from their classroom teacher.
- Teachers will provide a mix of online and offline work
- Blank work books for literacy and maths can be picked up from the front of school for students to complete written work in as requested by the teacher. These books will be collected at the end of Remote Learning.
- These have been sanitised and do NOT need to be returned to school.

 Books/skipping ropes can be collected between Monday and Wednesday 9:00-3:00pm.

Skipping ropes for PE activities are also available at the front of school for collection.

- Each level will be providing students with a 'Wellbeing Grid' with the focus on student wellbeing.
 - P 2 students this will be optional and completed at each family's discretion
 - 3 6 Students this will be a required weekly SEL lesson students need to complete and evidence 1 task per week, but have the choice to complete more if they wish.

St Patrick's will NOT be conducting any live online video/audio conferencing with students.

Specialists

Specialists will provide activities for students on the following days:

ART Mondays **FRENCH** - Tuesdays **DRAMA** - Thursdays

A PE Grid with daily activities for students to choose from will be shared with students.

Families may choose to do a different Physical Activity outside of the grid if they choose to do so.

Feedback will be provided for **1 Maths** task and **1 Literacy** task each week for each child.

Tasks completed on 'Seesaw' will be 'liked' by teachers as an acknowledgement that work has been received and viewed by the teacher. If the work is not completed as expected, the teacher will provide further feedback.

Any student that had an adjusted planner for last Remote Learning will have an adjusted planner for this Remote Learning period.

Parents of students on an adjusted program will be notified via email before the commencement of Remote Learning on the 20th July.

Information for students who are working on-site

Students who will be on-site:

- are not to arrive before 8:30am and must leave by 3:30pm (those children on the early/late buses will remain in the student foyer outside of these times)
- Will have temperature checks from 8:30am before heading into the courtyard before school
- can wear their sport uniform on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- will use the school laptops.
- will be supervised, however, the person supervising them will vary, and it often will not be their classroom teacher.
